Expected time on schoolwork per day	<ul> <li>The Department of Education recommendation is that schools provide activities that engage students in learning for approx ½ the length of a traditional school day, or approximately 3 hours per day.</li> <li>As with assignments when school is in session, the amount of time a task takes may vary by student based on skill level, motivation, and other factors.</li> </ul>
Schedule	<ul> <li>MPS believes it is important to give families some control over their daily schedule given varied needs at this time.</li> <li>Work assigned on Monday will be generally due by Friday.</li> <li>A variety of scheduled Google Meet sessions with teachers and support staff will be available during regular school hours, between 8am-2:20pm.</li> <li>Teachers will respond to email within 24 hours, Mon Fri.</li> </ul>
How learning activities will be assigned	<ul> <li>There will be a combination of asynchronous (choice of time and place) and synchronous (designated time and place) activities, using the following tools: Google Classroom, itsLearning, and Google Meet.</li> <li>Support services will be provided and arranged with families.</li> </ul>
Attendance	<ul> <li>Teachers are keeping a record of all student communication, engagement &amp; participation via email, completed assignments, google meet.</li> <li>Attendance is not being recorded in the traditional sense.</li> <li>All students are expected to participate and complete weekly assignments to the extent possible, given their unique circumstances. Please communicate with teachers.</li> </ul>
Grading	<ul> <li>Assigned work will be scored as "Credit" or "No Credit."         Teachers will explain the criteria for a given assignment. In some cases this might mean reaching a benchmark score on an assignment, for others it might mean thoughtful completion of an assignment. Communicate with your student's teacher if you have questions.</li> <li>Teachers will be recording assignment completion in PowerSchool and providing feedback. Some of this feedback may include a numerical score, however this score will not be calculated into a final grade.</li> <li>Teachers will also be providing narrative feedback using a variety of means, to the extent possible.</li> </ul>
