| Attendance | - Teachers are keeping a record of all student communication, engagement \& participation via email, completed assignments, google meet. <br> - Attendance is not being recorded in the traditional sense. <br> - All students are expected to participate and complete weekly assignments to the extent possible, given their unique circumstances. Please communicate with teachers. |
| Grading | - Assigned work will be scored as "Credit" or "No Credit." Teachers will explain the criteria for a given assignment. In some cases this might mean reaching a benchmark score on an assignment, for others it might mean thoughtful completion of an assignment. Communicate with your student's teacher if you have questions. <br> - Teachers will be recording assignment completion in PowerSchool and providing feedback. Some of this feedback may include a numerical score, however this score will not be calculated into a final grade. <br> - Teachers will also be providing narrative feedback using a variety of means, to the extent possible. |
